

As I look back at how I have changed over the years, in many ways I see things differently, hopefully have grown in some

maturity, but in a lot of other ways, I find the same struggles and failings that I have always had. I have come to the conclusion that I'm never going to be 'perfect', and efforts to spend time trying to be are really just my 'ego' wanting recognition. In challenging this 'dualistic thinking', that all is either good or bad, an integrated way of looking at things says that all is one and open to the Mystery. What seems much more important to me now is the degree of transparency that I have with my brothers about my living. It has been said that we are as 'sick as our secrets', and I think that that is true. I am healthy to the extent that I am open to sharing all parts of my life with nothing held back.

This requires creating environments where people can share safely, something we have not always been good at in the past. Yet, when it does happen, a whole new world of brotherhood opens up for a community, and the impact on others is profound. When people are able to share their vulnerability, particularly I've found in the area of sexuality, doors are opened which have been closed for years. Men realise that our common humanity brings us to a depth of brotherhood which we have avoided often through not coming to grips with past hurts, fear of vulnerability, living in isolation, or putting our own individual pursuits before community considerations. This kind of brotherhood is what I want to live into the future. I see it as central to any community that wants to call itself an 'Our Way into the Future' community. Goodwill is needed, and good skills too, so that training in sharing deeply will be important to develop the way of living we aspire to, and helping us to overcome the fears that would block us.

PRAYER





■ READING

WITH CONFIDENCE WE GROW as a gospel community characterized by a love that struggles to cast out fear. In a deepening relationship with Christ we come to acknowledge the gifts of God in our brothers whom we affirm and support in fraternal love. We strengthen the bonds of our brotherhood by sharing our prayer and ministry, our joys, hopes and fears (*Constitution 31*).

This is a call to a very adult way of living, a gospel way that calls for fraternal love, relationship with Jesus, affirmation, support and sharing. This is not easy as community living at any level of depth is difficult. It is no coincidence that this call is being reiterated now in Our Way into the Future. If we cannot form community among ourselves, what do we have to bring to the future? If we cannot learn the gospel call to community, how can we teach

it? And as the Constitution wisely states, it is often not ill will that is the obstacle to community but fear. That is why the Scripture tells us only love will work to drive out this fear and form community (1 John 4:18).

Is gospel community too much to ask? The answer has to be 'no' and the proof of that is in each community that is striving to grow and to follow the call of the Gospel. We have many of these communities in the Congregation. The key word is 'striving'. These are communities which realize that community is not a goal to be arrived at but a road to follow together, a road of relationship, a path from which we will sometimes fall but which we continue walking because we feel the need and desire to grow in this way. Put more simply, these are communities that brothers are happy to be in and to work with because this is what being Christian Brother is meant to be.

We open to you with humble hearts, and minds incapable of containing the mystery – yet with hearts that can hold the wonder, spilling out


everywhere, in every moment, for those with eyes to see, and ears to hear.



PRAYER



■ READING

WE ARE LEARNING FROM THE UNIVERSE that we are made for relationship. As brothers we are attempting to grow in authentic community living, beyond superficiality, growing in 'a love that struggles to cast out fear' (*Constitution 31*). As we experience this deeper level of connection, we deepen the sense of relatedness with all of life and we have a better sense of what it means to call ourselves 'brother'. We nurture the soil of brothering that allows

us to collaborate deeply in imagining shared future possibilities.

We are experiencing diminishment as a Congregation, obliged to surrender power and control in many places. Perhaps the experiences of profound humiliation and disturbance are proving to be an opportunity for us to grow beyond personal and collective ego.

We are shifting from head to heart. A deeper source of knowing deepens our capacity to open and see with our hearts, helped along the way by experiences like "The Heart of Being Brother" (2002 Chapter) and "God in the Now". There is more evidence of communities able to speak and listen from the heart. We are growing in humanity, valuing the relational and incarnational dimensions of our lives. The call to "grow in love and care for one another" (*Constitution 10*) is slowly becoming a reality among us.

Creating networks of communities around the world, we strive to be open and accepting, respectful and mutual as we become, together, midwives of the new that is being born through the 'God present in the people and events of our lives' (*Constitution 22*). We seek to be a leaven in society and church, building up local communities through educating young people and empowering local leaders.

Appreciating the universe as an emerging, living phenomenon, we are more and more aware of the interconnectedness of planetary life systems and the damage being caused by the current dominant models of development. Out of this awareness, there is an urgency in our efforts to educate others in living in harmony with nature and with one another as well as in our advocacy for new social structures.



READING

At the heart of community is the quality of presence. Presence grows as brothers begin to discover an ever-deepening consciousness of their own truth. By coming home to themselves brothers are able to connect with the very essence of their being, and therefore are able to grow in the awareness of the other.

Presence is an attentive connection with the other. When brothers begin to grow in intimacy they come to discover a deep richness in their fellow brothers, and learn how to enter into the sacred space of community where God becomes manifest as two or three gather.

At the heart of community is a commitment to make the community the main locus for a brother's life and work. Brothers live together, work together, celebrate together, making the life of the community their priority over personal relationships or personal ambition.
